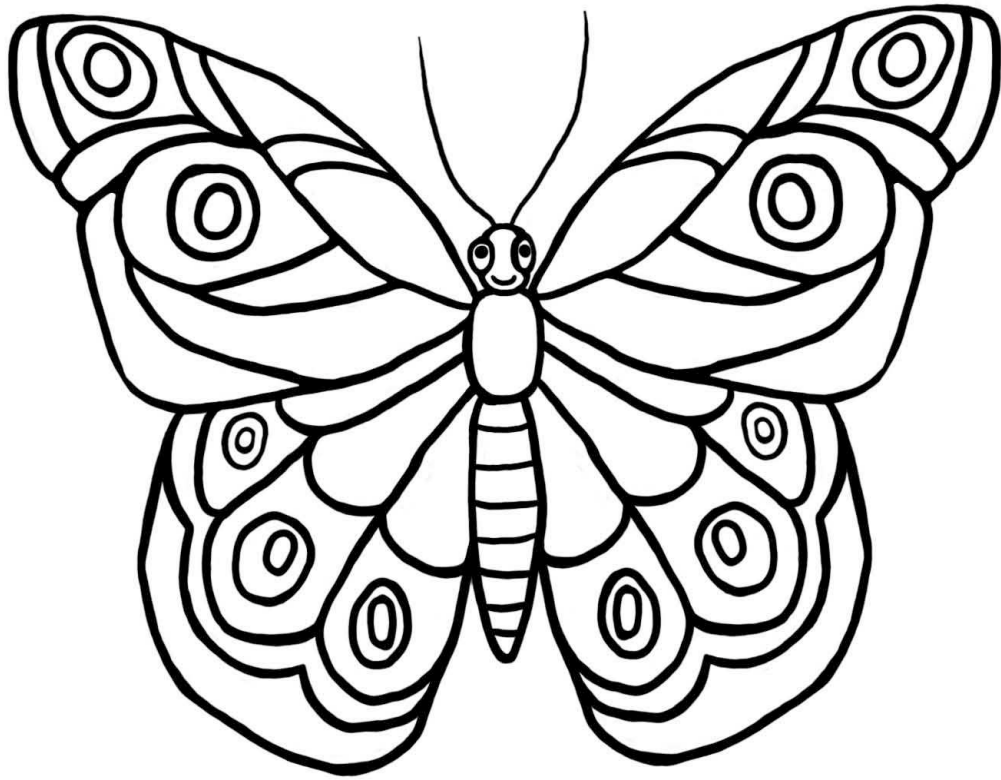


Let's learn our colors!
