### Cherufe



The Cherufe is a mythical creature from South America. He is a lava monster, believed to live in volcanoes of the Andes Mountains in Chile. Many people disagree on what he really looks like, but the cherufe is made of magma and volvanic rock, but appears in humanoid form.
