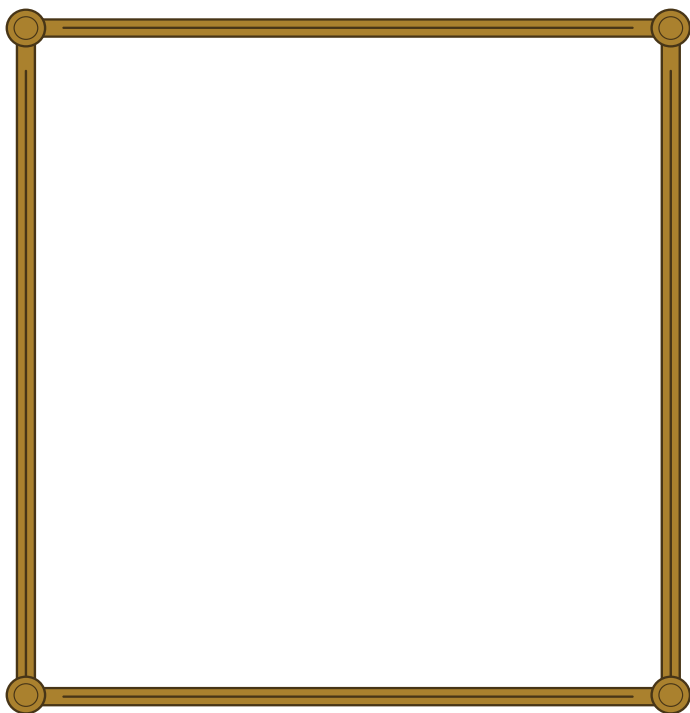
Forests in Greece

The Cherufe is a mythical creature from South America. He is a lava monster, believed to live in volcanoes of the Andes Mountains in Chile.
