## About Temperate Oceans:

The temperate oceans are found between the tropical oceans and the polar oceans. Temperate oceans are very productive, especially at coastlines. A hugely diverse range of animals live in temperate oceans, so many that people are still discovering new species routinely! These include some of the tiniest creatures such as microscopic zooplankton; crustaceans such as krill, crabs, and lobsters; endless varieties of fish such as tuna, salmon, herring, and cod; sharks, rays, mammals such as sea lions, dolphins, whales, and otters; jellyfish, turtles, corals, kelp, algae, and many others.

## Temperate Oceans Stats:

- Did you know that you can find forests in temperate oceans? Kelp forests are found along coastlines and aren't made up of plants, but seaweed, which is a type of algae. Some kelp can grow up to two feet in a day!

## About Temperate Oceans:

The temperate oceans are found between the tropical oceans and the polar oceans. Temperate oceans are very productive, especially at coastlines. A hugely diverse range of animals live in temperate oceans, so many that people are still discovering new species routinely! These include some of the tiniest creatures such as microscopic zooplankton; crustaceans such as krill, crabs, and lobsters; endless varieties of fish such as tuna, salmon, herring, and cod; sharks, rays, mammals such as sea lions, dolphins, whales, and otters; jellyfish, turtles, corals, kelp, algae, and many others.

## Temperate Oceans Stats:

- Did you know that you can find forests in temperate oceans? Kelp forests are found along coastlines and aren't made up of plants, but seaweed, which is a type of algae. Some kelp can grow up to two feet in a day!
- Much of the world's fishing is done in temperate oceans.
- In coastal areas, temperate oceans support a large number of animals. This is because of coastal upwelling, which brings up nutrient-rich waters from the bottom.

Lava: Molten rock expelled by a volcano during an eruption.

Weathering: The breaking down of rocks, soils, and minerals through direct contact with the Earth's atmosphere.

Erosion: The process of the transport of solids from their natural source to a different location, usually through wind, water, and ice.
Igneous: One of the three types of rocks. Igneous rock is formed through the cooling and solidification of lava or magma.
Sedimentary: One of the three types of rocks.
Sedimentary rocks are formed from the deposition of mineral or organic sediments.
Metamorphic: One of the three types of rock. Metamorphic rocks are created by the transformation of existing rock through heat and pressure.
Seamount: A mountain rising from the bottom of the ocean, but that does not reach above the surface of the water.
Mountain: A landform that stands higher than the surrounding land, and often has steeper sides than a hill. They are usually formed through volcanism, plate tectonics, or occasionally erosion.

TERMS:
HYPOCOTYL: is the stem of a seedling.
FRUIT: a fleshy part of the plant that grows from the ovaries of a flower.

SEED: refers to the whole structure that contains the zygote and endosperm, and that will germinate to grow a seedling.

GERMINATION: the process of a seedling sprouting out of a seed.

ZYGOTE: an embryonic plant inside the seed.
ENDOSPERM: tissue within the seed that provides nourishment for the zygote.

GAMETOPHYTE: the phase of a plant's life in which the eggs and sperm are created.

RADICLE: is the first part of a seedling to emerge from the seed, and it becomes the main root of the plant.

COTYLEDON: are the first leaves to emerge from the seed.

EPICOTYL: is the shoot that grows above the cotyledons, and grows into additional stems and leaves.
