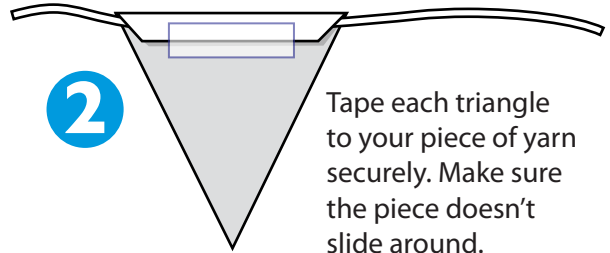
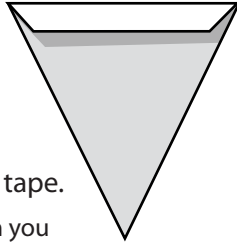


WINTER FUN BANNER!

Make your banner any length by printing as many pages as you like. The more pages, the longer the banner! Use thicker paper for best results.

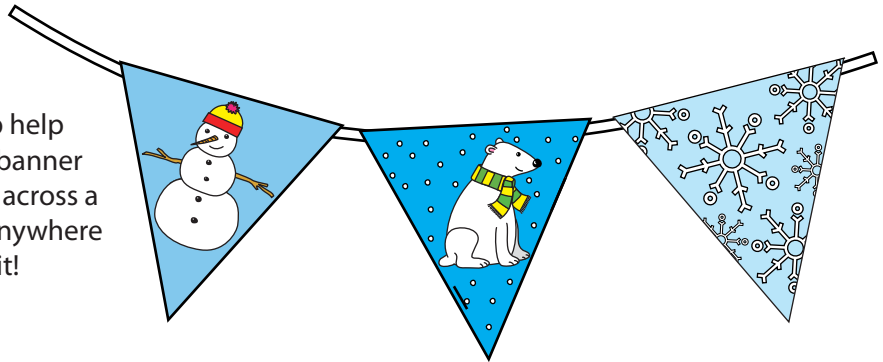
1 After the pieces have been colored, ask a grown-up to help cut and fold the shapes. You will need string, ribbon or yarn, and some tape.

To figure out how much yarn you will need, just line up all the pieces with spaces in between, then measure and add a little extra on each end for tying or taping.

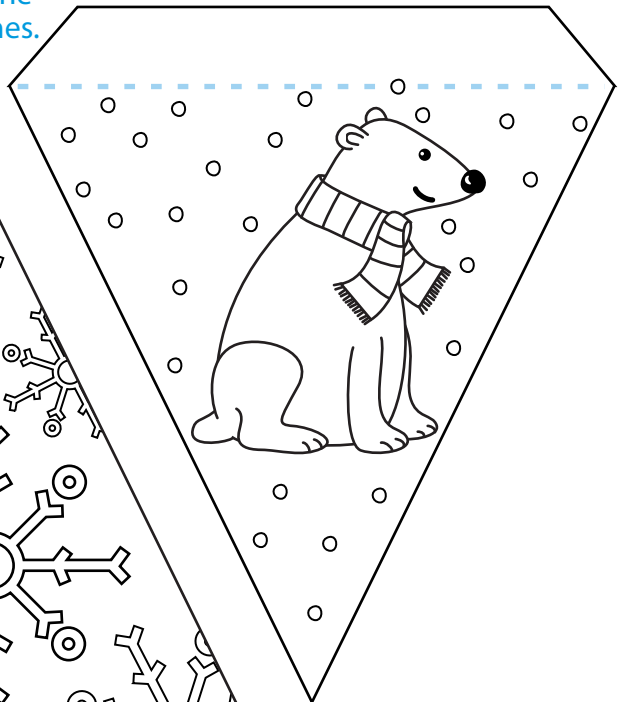
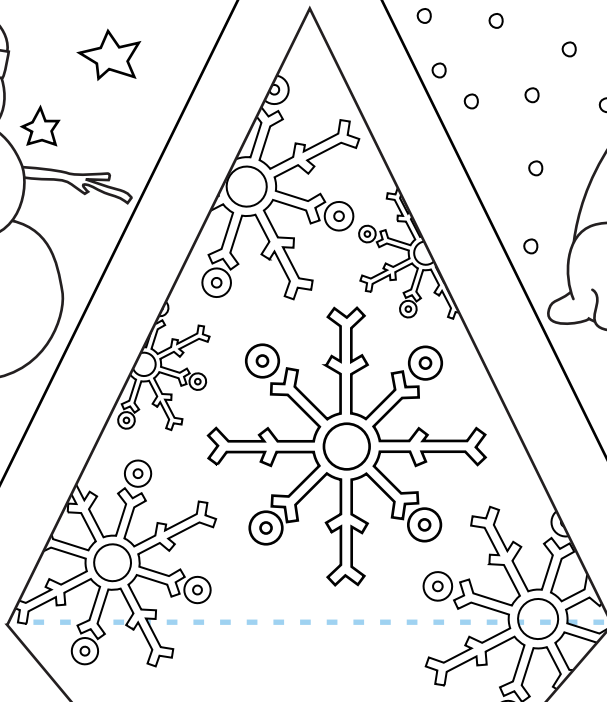
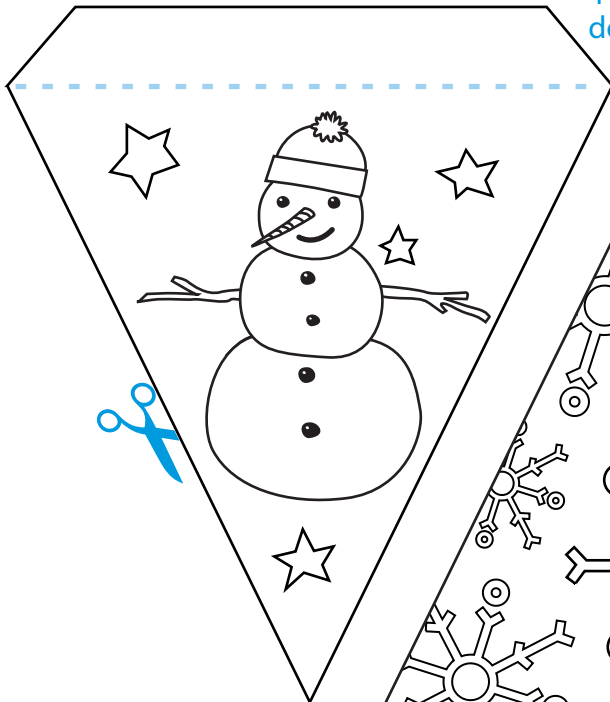


Tape each triangle to your piece of yarn securely. Make sure the piece doesn't slide around.

3 Have a grown-up help tape or pin your banner up in your room, across a big window, or anywhere there's space for it!

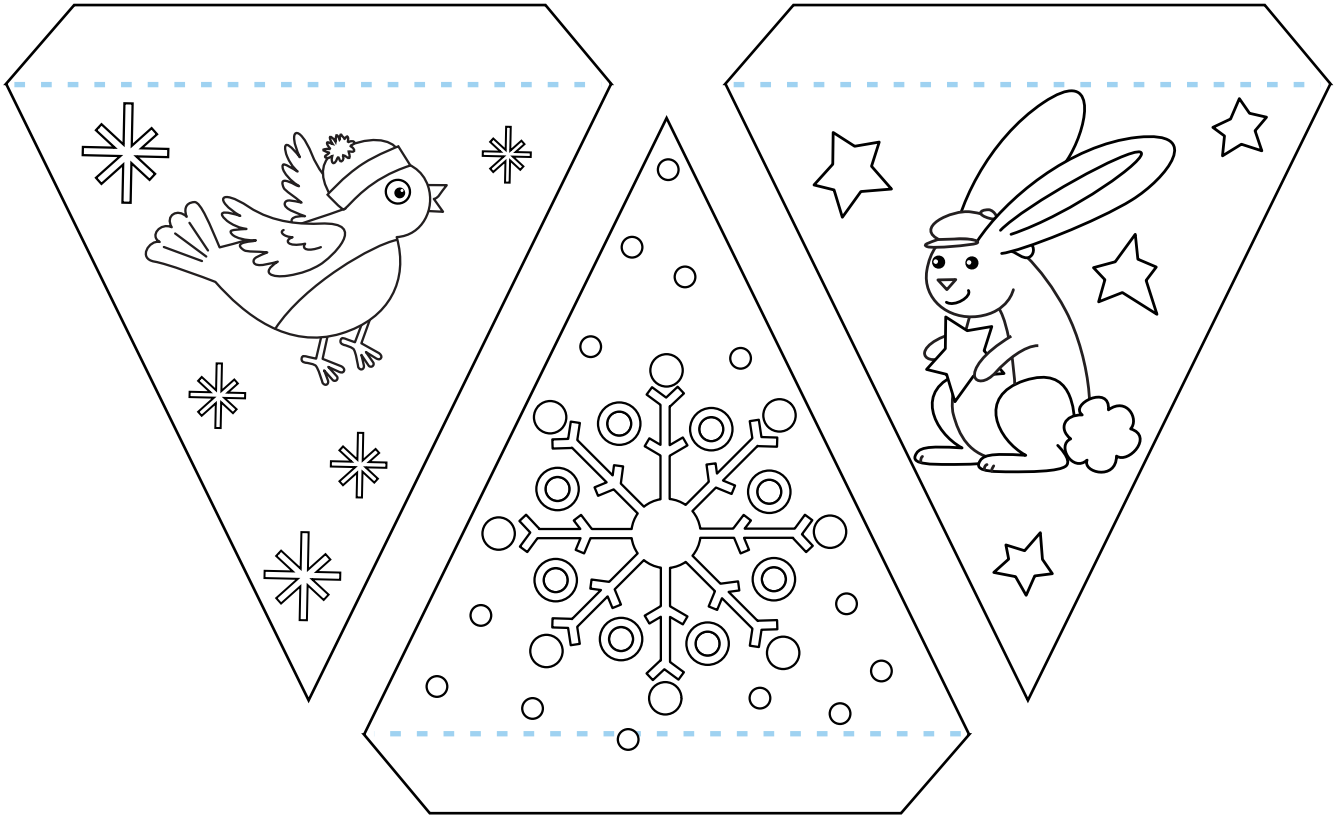

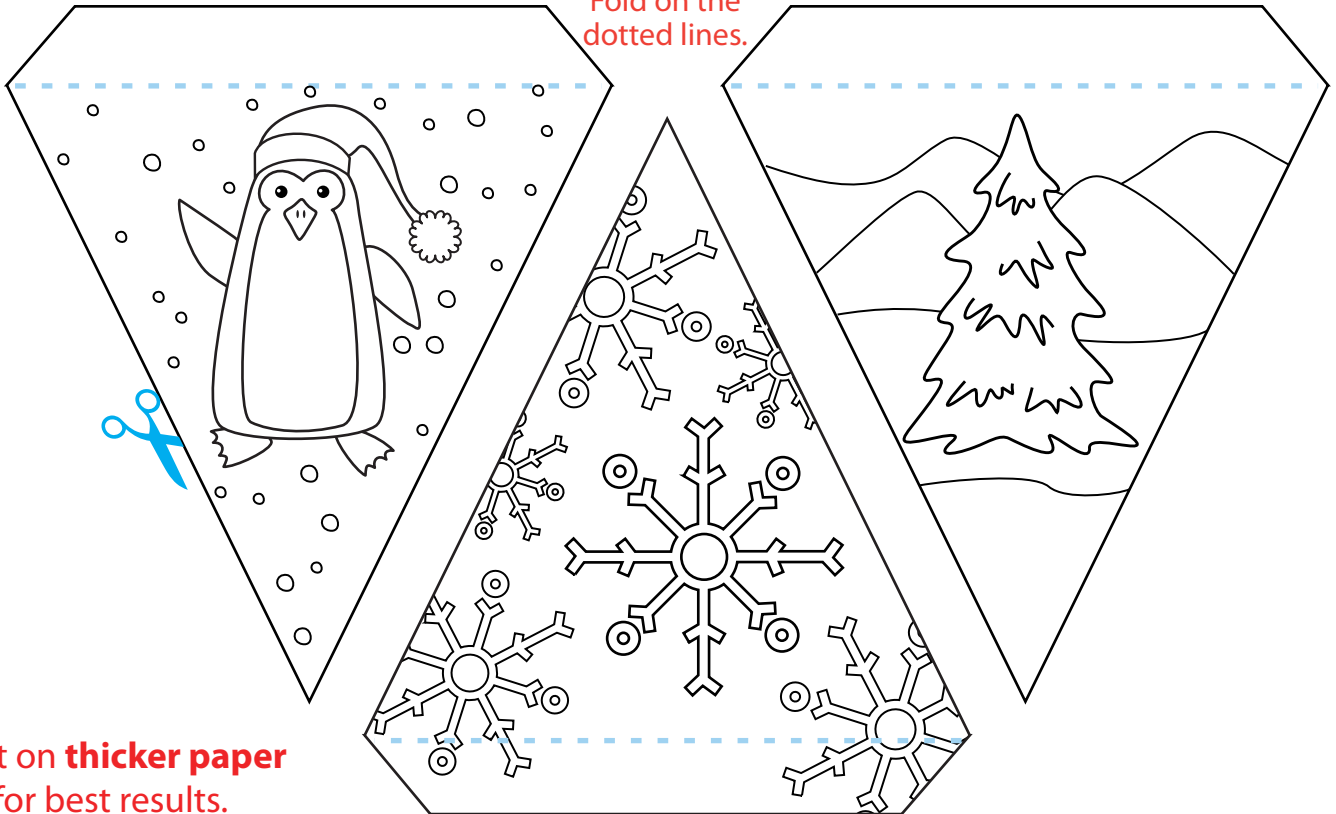

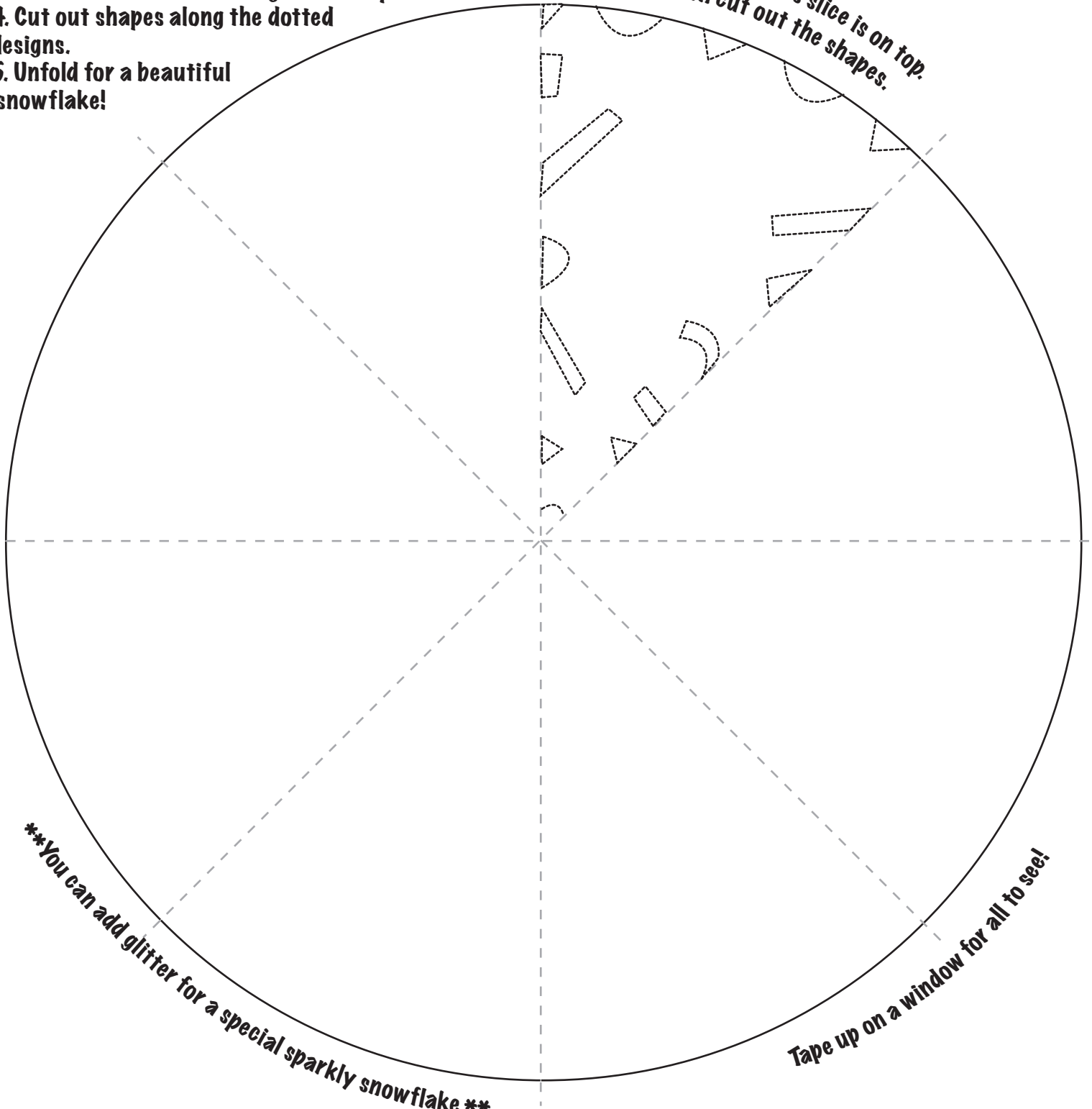


Make a Paper Snowflake!

Make a pretty snowflake to decorate for the holidays.

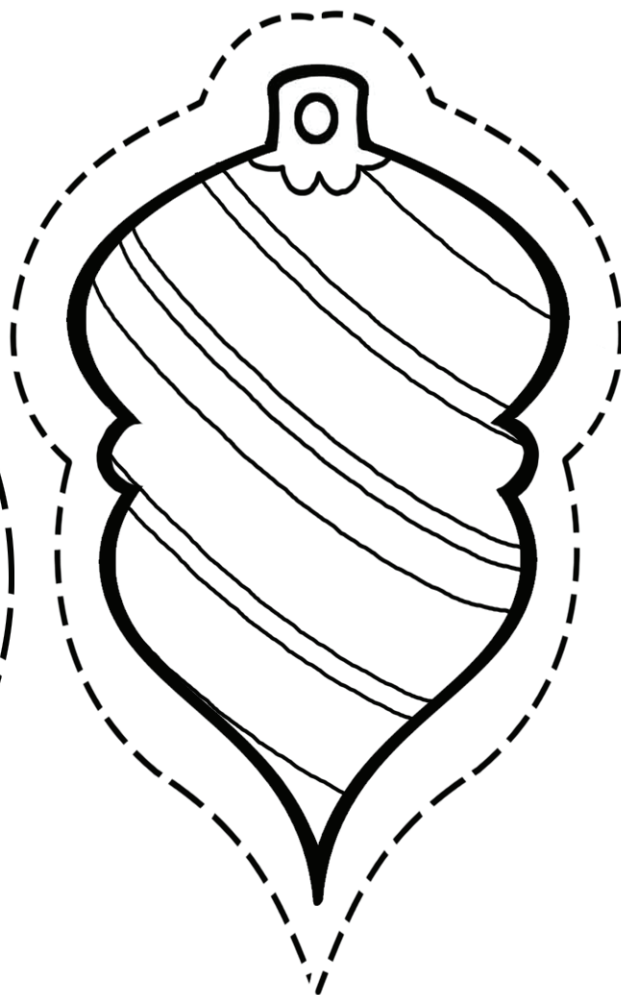
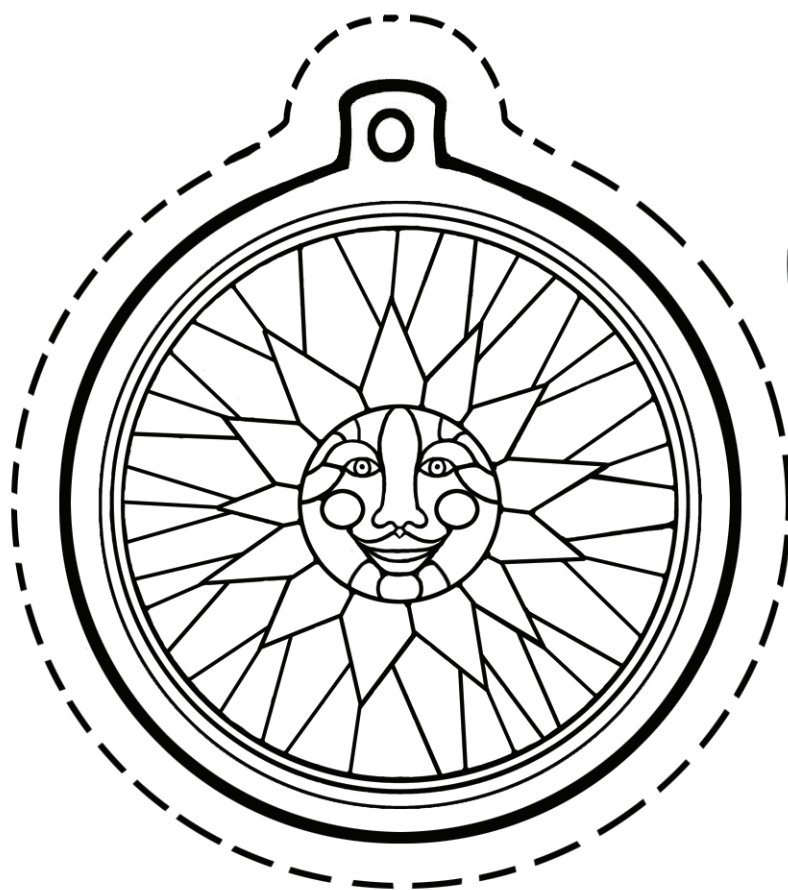
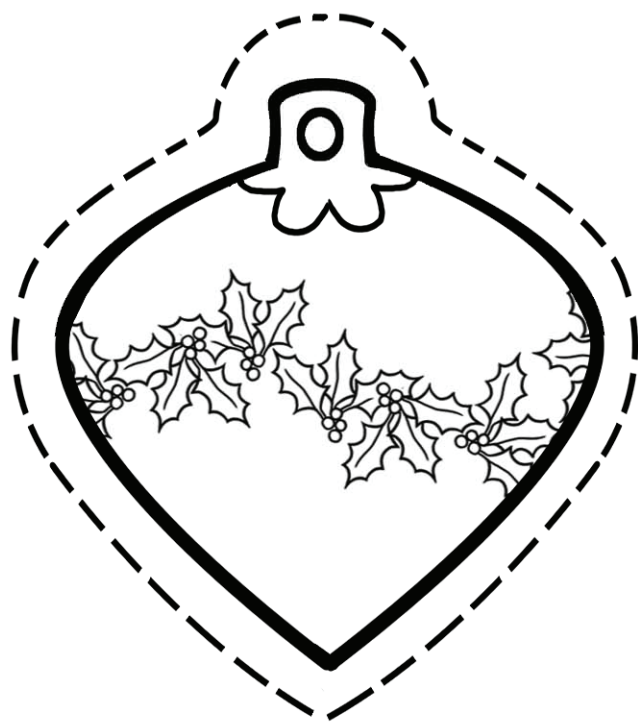
1. Carefully cut out the circle.
2. Fold in half along the dotted lines.
3. Fold in half twice more along the lines. Make sure the slice with the small designs is on top.
4. Cut out shapes along the dotted designs.
5. Unfold for a beautiful snowflake!

*Make sure this slice is on top.
Then cut out the shapes.*



You can add glitter for a special sparkly snowflake.

Tape up on a window for all to see!



Wonderful Winter!

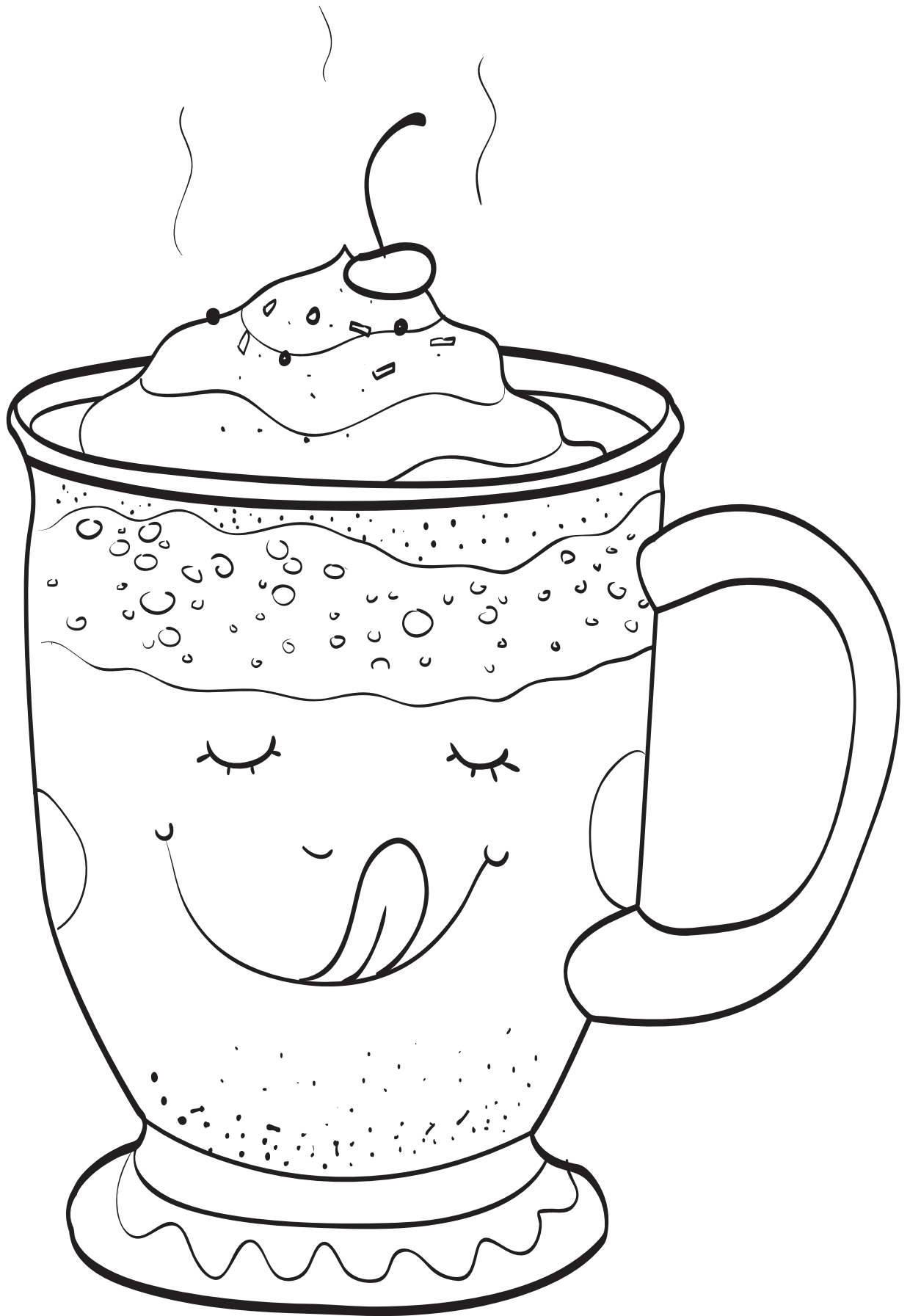
Can you find all of the snowmen in the illustration below? Hint: There are 27 snowmen in total.

Turn off the TV and read a Christmas story by the fire.

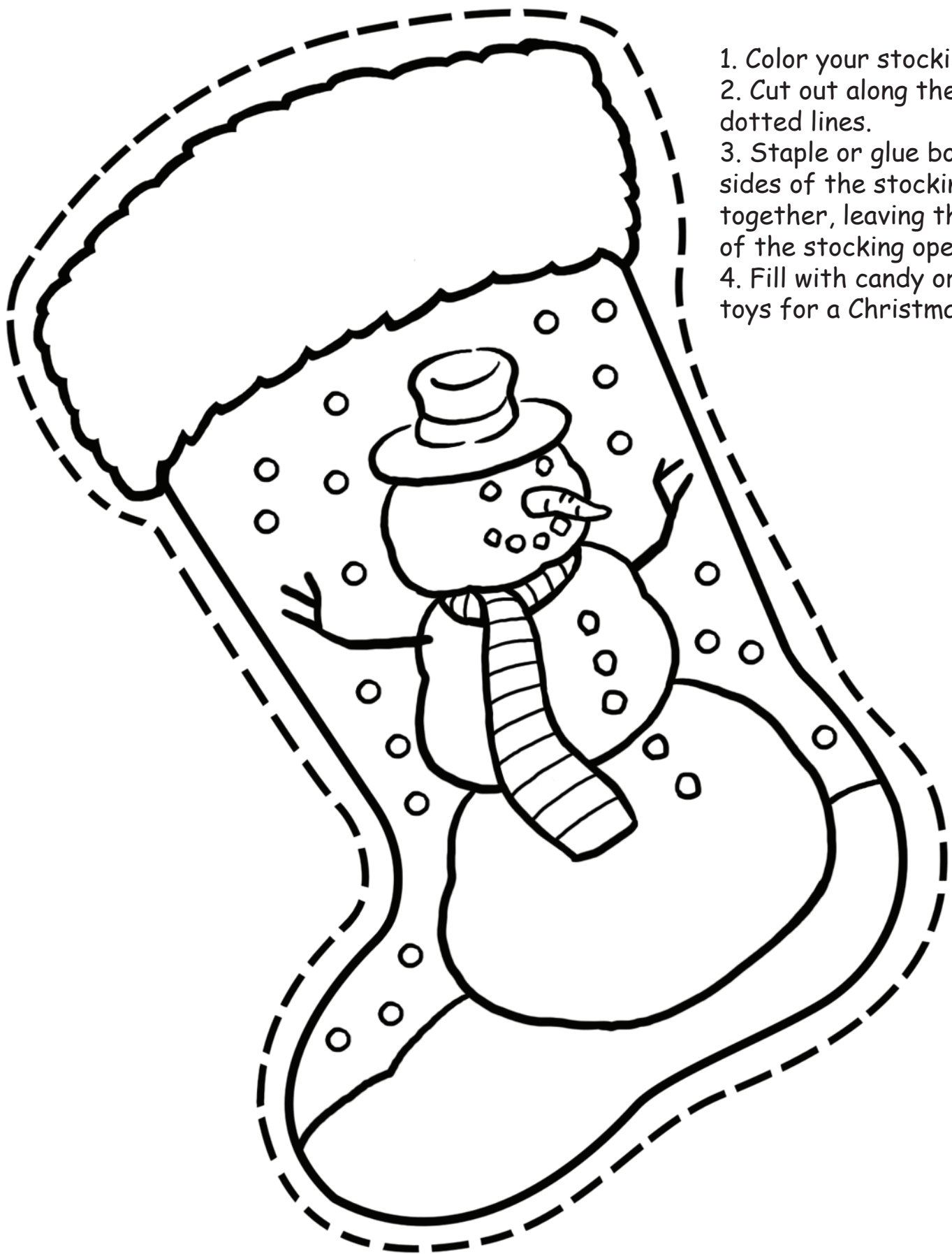
Make your picture frame out of paper and give it to a parent for Christmas.

Make sure you go to bed early tonight!

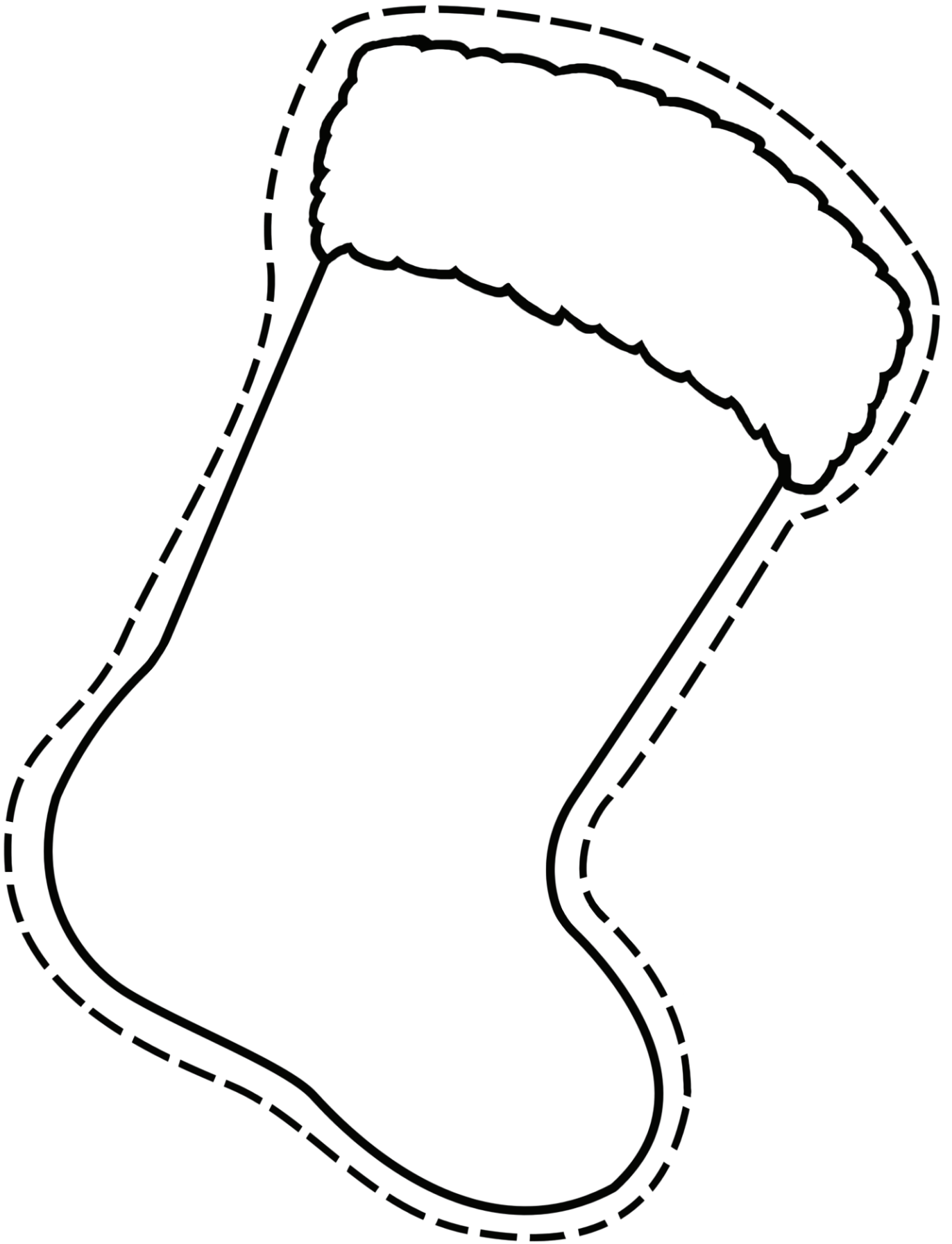
Merry Christmas! Today is meant to be spent with loved ones! Make sure to thank everyone for your gifts.

Make a Mini Christmas Stocking!

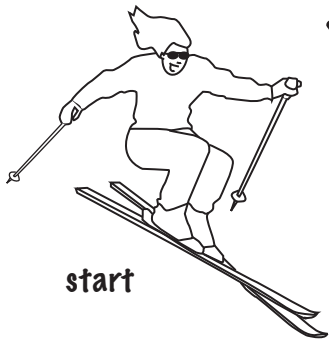


1. Color your stocking.

4. Fill with candy or small toys for a Christmas treat!

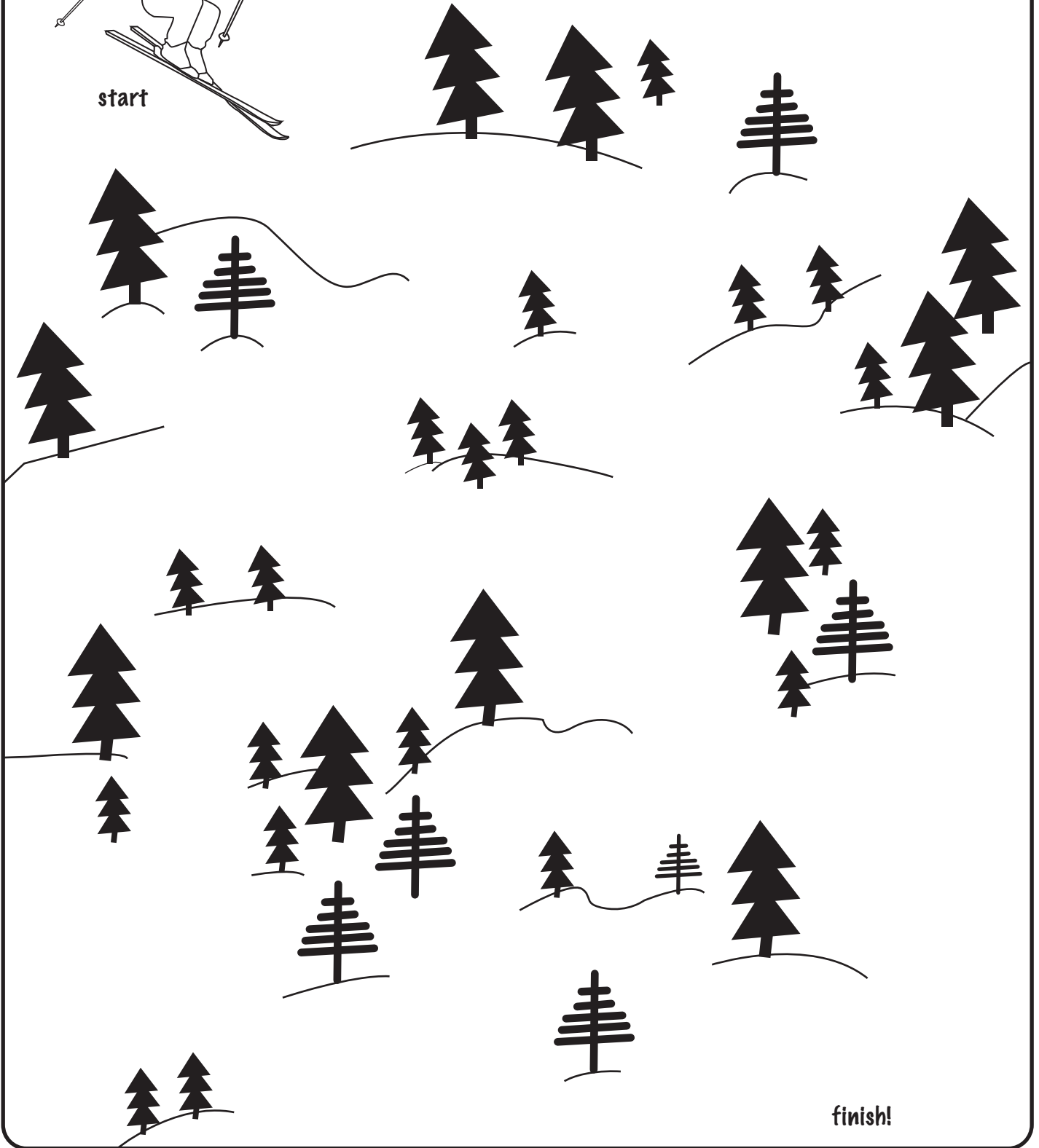


Ski Maze

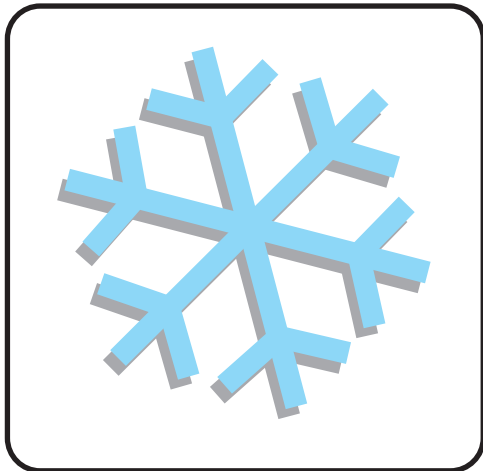

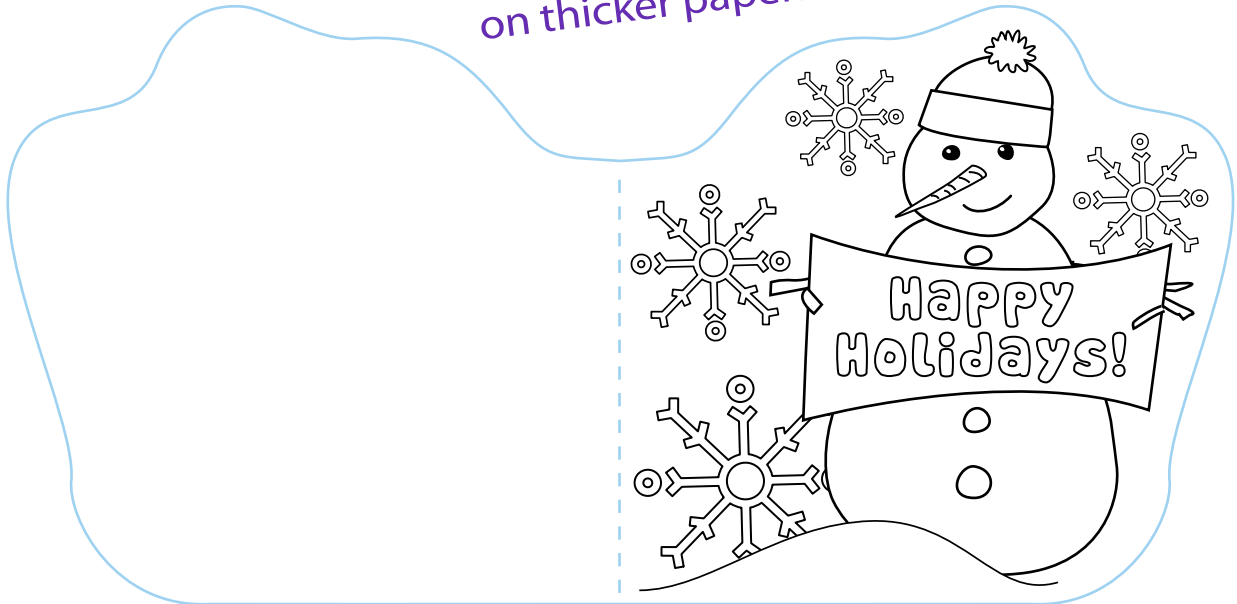


Holiday CARDS

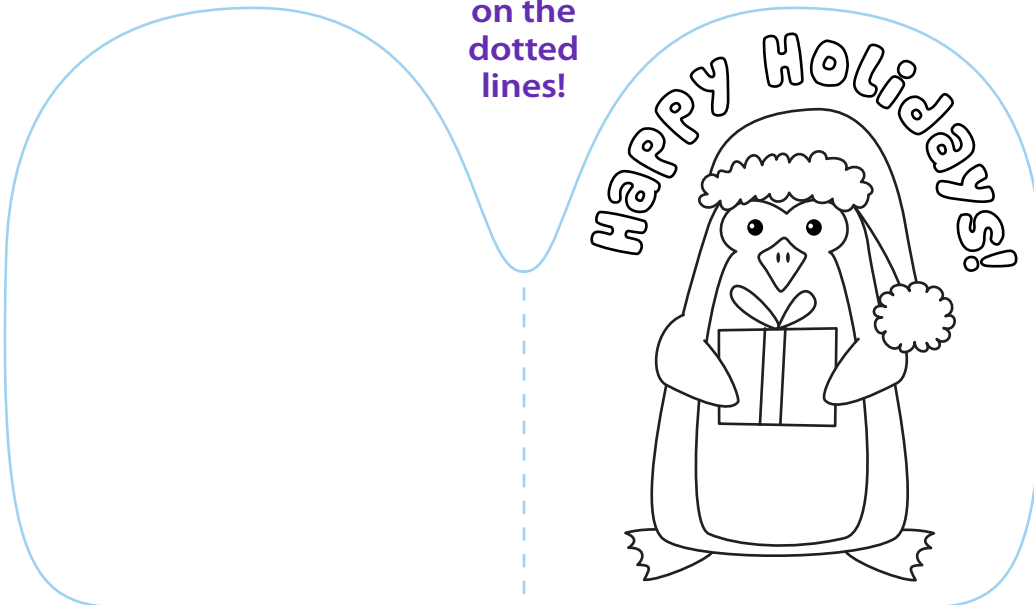
After coloring, cut the cards roughly out from the page. Fold on the dotted lines, then cut out the shapes. Make sure not to cut the edges holding the cards together!

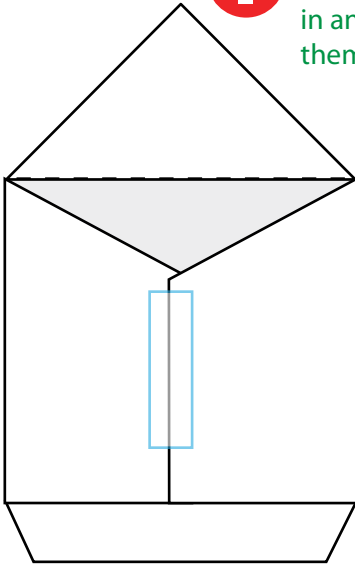

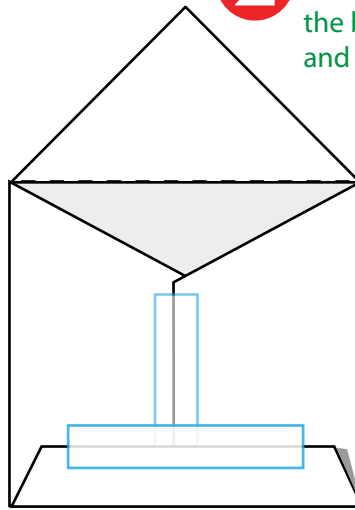

1 Fold the sides in and tape them together.



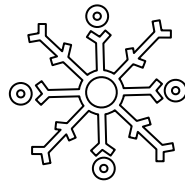
