

HALLOWEEN SENTENCES:

A and **an** are special words called **articles**. Use these rules to help you decide which article to use:

- Use **a** if the next word starts with a consonant sound (**a** skeleton)
- Use **an** if the next word starts with a vowel sound (**an** idea)



Be sure to pay attention to the *sound* rather than the *letter*. Sometimes there are vowels that make a consonant sound, like **one-eyed monster**. Here, we use the article **a** since **one-eyed** begins with a consonant sound.
