Adjective, Adverb, and Noun Clauses #1

Clauses are grammatical units that contain both a subject and a predicate. Dependent clauses can serve any of three functions in a sentence.



adjective clause

adverb clause

A noun clause functions as a noun in the sentence, often as the subject or the object of the verb.

Wildever illiade illis pie is all alliazilia bakei	Whoever made this	pie is an	amazing	baker.
--	-------------------	-----------	---------	--------

The noun clause whoever made this pie serves as the subject of the sentence.

Now I know what dessert I want for every holiday.

The noun clause what dessert I want for every holiday serves as the object of the verb know.

An adjective clause functions as an adjective in the sentence by modifying a noun or pronoun.

The rollercoaster that we rode yesterday was named the most thrilling in the country.

My friends who live in Peru are here for a visit.

The adjective clause who live in Peru gives more information about the noun friends.

The thing that I miss most about Peru is the food.

The adjective clause that I miss most gives more information about the noun thing.

An **adverb clause** functions as an adverb in the sentence by telling when, where, why, how, how much, or under what condition the situation in the sentence is taking place.

When summer arrived, we went on a camping trip.

The adverb clause when summer arrived tells when the verb went is taking place.

We pitched our tent where the ground was flat.

The adverb clause where the ground was flat tells where the verb pitched is taking place.
