How does rounding the numbers change the information? Sample Answer

Rounding the numbers gives a general idea, rather than a precise count. When I rounded the numbers, I either increased the number in the hundred thousands place or lowered the number. I then added zeros from the ten thousands place to the ones place. Rounding these job totals changed the number of the jobs by either increasing or decreasing them. That means that the numbers are no longer precise and some of the values represent more than the actual amount of workers in that occupation, or some occupations are underrepresented. That at being said, the numbers are easier to remember and describe given that there are more zeros in more places.
