Answer Key





A **conjunction** is a word that joins together words, phrases, or parts of sentences. Some common conjunctions include: **and**, **or**, **but**, **for**, **nor**, **yet**, **so**.

EXAMPLE: I like to play baseball, but I also like swimming.
