Cool Comparative Adjectives

A **comparative adjective** compares two nouns. There are some rules for turning adjectives into comparative adjectives.

| Add -er to a one syllable word. (Sometimes it is necessary to double the final consonant!) Big → Bigger Mean → Meaner |
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| 2. Add -r to a one syllable word ending with an "e" Large → Larger 3. If a two syllable word ends with a "y", change it to "i" and add -er. Funny → Funnier 4. For words with more than two syllables, use the word "more" or , "less" before the adjective. Do not add the -er suffix. |
