Comparative adjectives compare two nouns. Many comparative adjectives end in -er. Here are a few rules to remember when turning adjectives into comparative adjectives.

If your adjective has one syllable and ends with an e, drop the e and add -er!

cute → cuter

If your adjective has one syllable, one vowel, and one consonant at the end, double the final consonant and add -er!

big → bigger

If your adjective has two syllables and ends with a y, change the y to an iand add -er!

silly → sillier
