Final /e/: Inflected Ending Rules

The final /e/ goes by many names. Whether you call it the sneaky e, silent e, or magic e, it does the same job!

To add an inflectional ending (-ing or -ed), you must drop the -e, and then add either -ing or -ed.

Example:

hope \rightarrow hoping hope \rightarrow hoped
