
Did You Know That Fish Can Walk?

The spotted handfish is a small fish found in the coastal bays and estuaries of Tasmania, Australia. It lives at the bottom of the water and eats worms, shellfish, and crustaceans that live in the sand.

This rare sea creature has pectoral fins that look like your own human hands. Instead of wading through the water to swim, it uses its hands to push forward. The spotted handfish moves very slowly through the water.

A Surprising Fact:

Today there aren't many spotted handfish left. It is believed that Northern Pacific seastars have been eating up handfish eggs.
