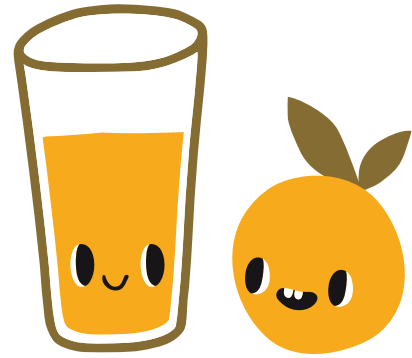


Prepositions

A **preposition** is a connecting word. It comes before a noun or pronoun and connects it to the rest of the sentence. Prepositions usually tell about time, place, or movement.
