Identify Misplaced and Dangling Modifiers #2

A modifier is a word or group of words that describes another word or phrase in the same sentence. A **misplaced modifier** appears to describe the wrong part of the sentence, usually because it's too far away from the word or phrase it should be modifying.

Example: Mack lagged behind the tour guide, <u>weary from a long day of sightseeing in Savannah</u>.

→ This wrongly suggests that Mack's tour guide, rather than Mack, was exhausted from sightseeing.

A **dangling modifier** appears to describe the wrong part of the sentence because the word or phrase it should be modifying is missing from the sentence altogether.

Example: <u>Walking into the science lab</u>, the test tubes and beakers were on the table.

→ This wrongly suggests that the test tubes and beakers were walking into the lab.
