

# Identify Prepositions and Their Objects

A **preposition** is a connecting word. It comes before a noun or pronoun and connects it to the rest of the sentence. The noun or pronoun that comes after the preposition is called the **object of the preposition**.



Luca put his favorite shoes **under** the bed.

**Under** is the preposition. It connects the object, bed, to the rest of the sentence.

Most prepositions tell about time, place, or movement.

Some common prepositions are **about, above, across, after, around, behind, below, beside, by, down, during, from, inside, into, near, of, on, outside, over, through, under, and with**.
