Identifying Subjects and Predicates

Every complete sentence contains two parts: a **subject** and a **predicate**. The **subject** is what or whom the sentence is about, while the **predicate** is the action part that tells something about the **subject**. **Note:** SUBJECT = noun/pronoun. PREDICATE = verb/verb phrase.

Example: The man ran to the store to make it in time before it closed.


