Answer Key It's Grammar Time: Relative Pronouns (That, Which)

A relative pronoun connects a noun with a relative clause that gives more information about the noun. Relative pronouns are usually located after the noun. That makes it clear which person, place, or thing is being referred to.

Two of the most common relative pronouns are *that* and *which*.

that	Refers to things.The meaning of the sentence would change without the word and the relative clause.	The show <u>that</u> I watched started at 7:00pm.	
which	 Refers to things and animals. The meaning of the sentence would not change without the word and the relative clause. (It is additional information.) 	The show, <u>which</u> lasted an hour, was funny.
