El Camino Real de Tierra Adentro

El Camino Real de Tierra Adentro is a historic trail from Mexico City, Mexico, to San Juan Pueblo, near Santa Fe, New Mexico. This road boasts many interesting <u>characteristics</u>. For example, the name means "The Royal Road of the Interior Land" in Spanish.

<u>In addition</u> to its interesting name, this road was the longest road in North America at one time. Just how long is El Camino Real? The trail is about 1,600 miles long. Parts of the trail were used by Native Americans around 1000 A.D. as a trade route. They would travel to tribal settlements along the trail to trade goods.


The Native Americans were just one of many groups that have relied on El Camino Real as a trade route. <u>For instance</u>, in 1598, the Spanish used the trail to send over 500 settlers to northern New Mexico. This made the trail an official Spanish trade route, which would be used for the next 300 years. Today, several modern highways cover parts of the historic <u>r</u>oute, though large sections are on city streets, as well.
