

Common or Proper?

Underline the **common nouns** and circle the **proper nouns** in the sentences.

A **common noun** names **any** person, place, or thing.

Examples: boy, state, month

A **proper noun** is the name of a **specific** person, place, or thing.

Proper nouns always begin with a capital letter.

Examples: Johnny, New York, February

(Caroline) lives in an apartment on (Caton Avenue).

(Jacob) is taking a plane to (California).

The zoo will be closed on (Labor Day).

(Nina's) birthday is in (March).

(Kim) is having a picnic with (Liam) in (Central Park).

(Uncle Ted) lives by the lake in (Wisconsin).

Did you see (Winston) at the party on (Friday)?

(Quinn) saw (Venus) through her telescope.
