
## Possessive Apostrophes With Punctuation Pig



Hi! I am Punctuation Pig. Let's learn about how **apostrophes** show the correct possessive form of a noun. Apostrophes are added to the end of a singular or plural noun to show possession.

## Here is an example:

singular: girl + 's = girl's • plural: girl + s' = girls'
