Pronouns are words that take the place of nouns. Some pronouns are:

SUBJECT PRONOUNS:

I, you, she, he, it, we, they

OBJECT PRONOUNS:

me, you, him, her, us, them

REFLEXIVE PRONOUNS:

myself, yourself, himself, herself, itself, ourselves, yourselves, themselves

DEMONSTRATIVE PRONOUNS:

this, that, these, those
