Prefix Practice: dis-, non-, un- Answer Key

A <u>prefix</u> is a word part attached to the beginning of a word to change the meaning of that word.

Prefixes that mean not or the opposite of:

dis + believe = disbelieve (not believe)

non + toxic = nontoxic (not toxic)

un + expected = unexpected (not expected)

Directions: Add the prefix dis-, non-, or un- to each base word to form a new word. There are some words that can be paired with more than one potential prefix.
