## **Puns in Context**

A **pun** is a figure of speech that involves using a word or phrase in a way that suggests multiple meanings. The pun might reference multiple senses of a word or a word that sounds similar but means something different. Puns are usually intended to create humor.



Directions: Explain the pun in each scenario below. Sample Answers

- 1. As with most social media trends, people are perplexed by the broom craze that is sweeping the nation. Sweeping means cleaning up dirt with a broom, but it can also mean quickly moving through and affecting an area.
- 2. Hank told me he was worried about the calendar because its days are numbered.

  The phrase "days are numbered" means that something will end soon. More literally, a calendar also labels days with numbers.
- 3. The tag on the bucket of used batteries at the yard sale said that the batteries were free of charge.

  "Free of charge" often means that you don't have to pay money for something. Here it also means that
  the used batteries don't have any electric energy left in them.
- 4. I wanted scrambled eggs for breakfast, but a hard-boiled egg is hard to beat.

  "Hard to beat" is a phrase that means something is very good and hard to surpass. The word "beat" also

  means to mix by stirring. It would be physically difficult to beat a hard-boiled egg for scrambled eggs.
- 5. Jazmyn often breaks into song because she can't find the key.

  If someone "breaks into" something, that means they are getting in without using a key. The phrase also means suddenly beginning something. A key is used to open a lock, but it's also a musical term.
- 6. When Wyatt's pencil broke during the spelling test, he decided the whole thing was pointless.

  Pointless means meaningless or unimportant, but here it also means that the pencil is lacking a point or a tip to write with.
- 7. I was standing there wondering why a softball gets bigger as it gets closer, and then it hit me.
  "It hit me" is a phrase that means you suddenly understand something, but it also means a physical object striking you.
- 8. The doctor assured me that I was of average height for my age, but I told her that was just mean.

  Mean is another word for a mathematical average, but it also means being unkind.
- 9. When the short fortune-teller escaped from jail, the judge issued a warrant for a small medium at large.

  Small, medium, and large are words for size. Here, small indicates that the person was short, medium is

  another word for a fortune-teller, and "at large" is a phrase that means someone has escaped.
