<p>In-Your-Own-Words Description of How The Story Ends:</p> <p>Rachel's feelings are hurt because her teacher demands that she put on a sweater because other students said it belonged to her. Her teacher was mean for forcing her to put it on. She cried hard, but her teacher didn't seem to care.
