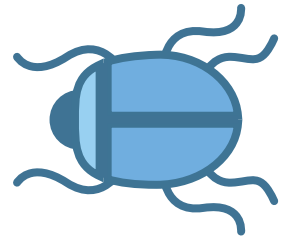


Read & Find Root Words #1
