## 'Saw' or 'Seen'



When you are talking about things that already happened, be sure to use the correct word!

The word **saw** is the past tense of the verb see.

Example: I saw a parade in my neighborhood.

The word **seen** is usually used with a helper verb (have, has, had, was).

Example: I have seen a parade in my neighborhood.
