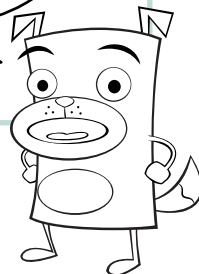


**ANSWERS****Seriously Fun Oxymorons!**

An **oxymoron** is a figure of speech made up of two or more words that actually have opposite meanings. Often these interesting phrases are used to create dramatic descriptions!

For example, "After staying up late, Emily felt like the living dead."

Hey! Aren't living and dead contradictory terms?



**Directions:** Underline the oxymoron in each sentence. Then explain why each of these phrases is an oxymoron.
