Great writers include facts and evidence to support ideas in an opinion text.

- A **fact** is a piece of information that can be proven. Facts are the strongest type of supporting details.
- **Evidence** is a piece of information taken from a text to support the main idea.

PART 1 Read the text. Underline three supporting details that support the opinion that homework should be banned from schools.

Homework is a set of tasks assigned to students by their teachers. The purpose of homework is for the students to practice skills outside of the classroom. Many teachers assign students reading, math, science, and social studies assignments for homework. When a student has homework in all subjects in the same night, there is a lot to do.

The goal of homework is to give students additional practice on skills and content taught in school. It can involve the parents in a child's learning. Homework can teach students that learning can occur anywhere. Research states that homework can also improve a student's attitude toward school.

However, homework can cause stress for some students and families. There are not many hours between school and bedtime for students in America. They are busy with family time, activities, dinner, and bedtime. Often, there is no time for homework. Homework gets in the way of leisure activities and rest. There is research that says that homework does not help students academically.
