SUMMER ANALOGIES

Analogies show relationships between two pairs of words.

EXAMPLE: scorching: hot:: frigid: cold

You can read the analogy like this:

scorching is to hot as frigid is to cold

Scorching is intensely hot, and frigid is intensely cold. These are both pairs of degree or intensity.



Some common analogy relationships include synonyms, antonyms, characteristics, degree, cause/effect, item/category, item/purpose, and part/whole.
