Lake Erie

Surface area: 9,910 sq. miles **Maximum depth:** 210 feet **Name Origin:** From a Native American word for "long tail"

Lake Ontario

Surface area: 7,340 sq. miles Maximum depth: 804 feet Name Origin: From a Native American word for "beautiful lake"
