What is the role of the legislative branch?	The legislative branch makes the laws.
What is Congress? What are its main parts?	Congress is the legislative branch of the federal government. It is broken up into two parts, the House of Representatives and the Senate.
List 3–5 powers that Congress has.	Congress has the power to: • make laws • collect taxes • coin or print money • congress has the power to: • declare war • approve presidential appointments
REPRESENTATIVES	
How many people are in each part of Congress?	There are 435 congresspeople in the House of Representatives. A state's number of representatives is based on the state's population. There are 100 senators. Each state has two senators.
What group do members of the House represent?	A member of the House of Representatives is elected by the popular vote to represent a district in their state.
What group do senators represent?	A senator is elected by the popular vote to represent their entire state.
How long is the term of office for a member of the House?	A term in the House is two years long.
How long is the term of office for a senator?	A term in the Senate is six years long.
