**4.** Thomas Jefferson wrote the Declaration of Independence in 1776. How can you tell this document is a primary source on the American Revolution (1775–1783)?

The Declaration of Independence was written in 1776, when the American Revolution was happening. Thomas Jefferson was present to witness those events. So, it is a primary source.

**5.** A historian named Gordon Wood wrote *The American Revolution: A History* in 1982. How can you tell this document is a secondary source on the American Revolution (1775–1783)?

The American Revolution: A History was written in 1982, nearly 200 years after the American Revolution ended. Gordon Wood could not have actually witnessed those events. So, it is a secondary source.
