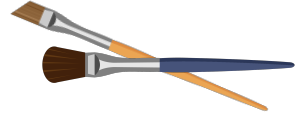


# Use Relative Adverbs



A **relative adverb** introduces a relative clause. A relative clause is a type of dependent clause that describes a noun.

There are three relative adverbs: **where**, **when**, and **why**.

- Use **where** to describe a place.

Hudson Arts is the place **where** Mia takes art classes.

- Use **when** to describe a time.

Autumn is the time of year **when** Hudson Arts has an art show.

- Use **why** to give a reason.

Mia shared the reason **why** she prefers watercolor paints.
