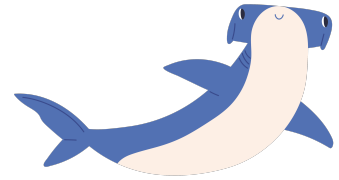


Using Coordinating Conjunctions: Aquarium
