

# Word Patterns in Sentences Level 2

Words with prefixes and suffixes follow patterns. Noticing and understanding these patterns can help you figure out their meanings.

Example: During an **election**, voters **elect** leaders.

During an **inspection**, mechanics **inspect** vehicles.
