Adjective, Adverb, and Noun Clauses #2

Clauses are grammatical units that contain both a subject and a predicate. Dependent clauses can serve any of three functions in a sentence.

A **noun clause** functions as a noun in the sentence, often as the subject or the object of the verb.

What my cat loves is sunbathing on the windowsill.	ndowsill. Isaac believed <u>that the kitten was hiding under the be</u>	
The noun clause what my cat loves serves as the	The noun clause that the kitten was hiding under the	
subject of the sentence.	bed serves as the object of the verb believed.	

An **adjective clause** functions as an adjective in the sentence by modifying a noun or pronoun.

The butterfly that I saw in the painting was colorful.	Anyone <u>who has a blue ticket</u> can enter the garden.	
The adjective clause that I saw in the painting gives	The adjective clause who has a blue ticket gives more	
more information about the noun <i>butterfly</i> .	information about the pronoun anyone.	

An **adverb clause** functions as an adverb in the sentence by telling when, where, why, how, how much, or under what condition the situation in the sentence is taking place.

Shortly after the foal was born, it stood up.	The horses grazed <u>wherever they could find grass</u> .	
The adverb clause <i>shortly after the foal was born</i> tells when the verb <i>stood</i> is taking place.	The adverb clause <i>wherever they could find grass</i> tells where the verb <i>grazed</i> is taking place.
