Adjectives in Context

Adjectives are words that tell what something looks like, smells like, tastes like, feels like, or sounds like. They **describe** nouns. Similes are creative ways to describe by comparing two things.

Example: The <u>dessert</u> was <u>sweet</u>.

† adjective

Simile: The dessert was as (sweet) as a flower.

The **dessert** and the **flower** are the nouns that are being compared.

The word \mathbf{sweet} is the adjective describing both nouns.
