CELEBRITY WEREWOLF:

Lon Chaney, Jr. in 1941's The Wolf Man. The Wolf Man was released in the early 1940s and helped popularize monster movies during that time period. The Wolf Man is mostly remembered for using special effects that were groundbreaking at the time. Movies about werewolves had been made before, but none had ever shown the man's transformation to wolf on screen because filmmakers couldn't make it look realistic.
