
Alligator vs. Crocodile


Did you know alligators are actually a type of crocodile? The crocodile family has been around for 240 million years, longer than dinosaurs lived!

Crocodiles and alligators...

- · are reptiles
- · live both in the water and on land
- · swim up to 20 miles per hour
- · can hold their breath for an hour
- · run up to 11 miles per hour
- · have eyes on the top of their heads
- · can see well in the dark
- · have good hearing with slits for ears
- · have a good sense of smell

What makes alligators a special kind of crocodile?





Snout wide, U-shaped, round,

looks like a shovel

longer, more narrow, V-shaped

Jaw overlaps the lower jaw

hiding its lower teeth, has an "overbite"

upper and lower jaws are the same size

Hind legs no fringe,

webbed feet

fringe on legs and feet

Size American alligators are

6-19 feet long

Chinese alligators are

5-7 feet long

African and Australian

crocodiles are up to 20 feet long and weigh over 2,200 pounds, smaller crocodiles are 6 feet long

Habitat pre

prefer fresh water

no salt glands

can live easily in salt water due to salt glands on their tongues
