# Beading Project

Directions

1. Cut out vertical strips and beads.

2. Cut the dotted lines on beads. (Hint, don't stab! Just fold the bead in half and make a small cut to get the line started.)

3. Thread beads on strips using the openings you have cut.

4. Cut the dotted lines on strips.

5. Secure ends of the bracelet.
