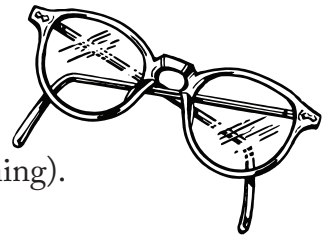


Character Changes Order

After hearing her teacher's stories, she started to feel encouraged to use her glasses.

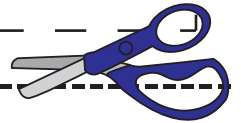
In the beginning, Ava was discouraged.
