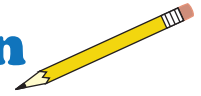




# Choose an End Punctuation



**Declarative** sentences make a statement.

Use a **period** as the end punctuation for a declarative sentence.



**Interrogative** sentences ask a question.

Use a **question mark** as the end punctuation.



**Exclamatory** sentences express an emotion or excitement.

Use an **exclamation point** as the end punctuation.
