

# Non-Identifying Clauses

Non-Identifying clauses are normally separated by commas.  
Look at the example below and complete the comma exercises below.

## EXAMPLE

The chicken sandwich had mustard.

The chicken sandwich, **which I ate yesterday**, had mustard.
