How to Write a Conclusion for Informational Text



Introduction

The introduction tells the reader what the topic is. Writers often use a hook, like a question or surprising statement, to get their readers interested in the topic.

Step 1:

Underline the hook in the introduction paragraph.

Body

Writers use the body to tell their reader important facts about the topic.

Step 2:

Highlight one key word or phrase in each body paragraph that you would want a reader to remember.

Conclusion

The conclusion is the last paragraph. Writers use the conclusion to remind readers what they've learned and excite them about the topic.

Step 3:

Write a conclusion.

- Remind readers of the main facts.
- Make a connection back to the hook.
- Add a memorable ending.
