

# Crafting a Thesis Statement

## Literary Essay Writing



A **thesis statement** states what you believe and what you intend to prove.

A thesis statement...

- ✓ unifies an essay.
- ✓ is clear and specific.
- ✓ can be supported with strong evidence.

A **“hook”** is a sentence that grabs the reader’s attention. Choose one type of hook to start your introduction.

To hook the reader from the start:

- ✓ use a quote from the text or a character.
- ✓ include descriptive words that paint a picture.
- ✓ pose a question.
