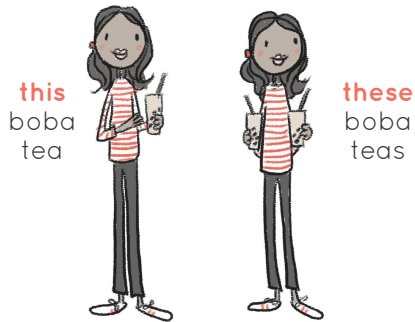


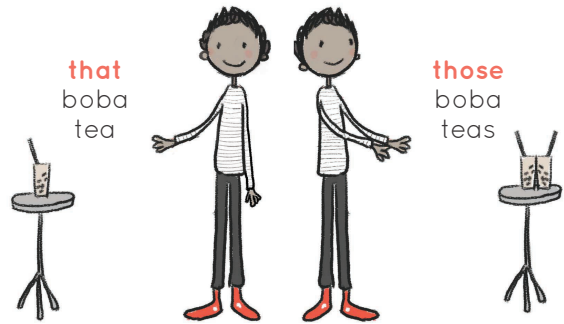
Demonstrative Pronouns

Demonstrative pronouns point out a person, place, thing, or idea.

This and **these** point out things that are *near* the speaker.



That and **those** point out things that are *far from* the speaker.



This and **that** are singular. • **These** and **those** are plural.
