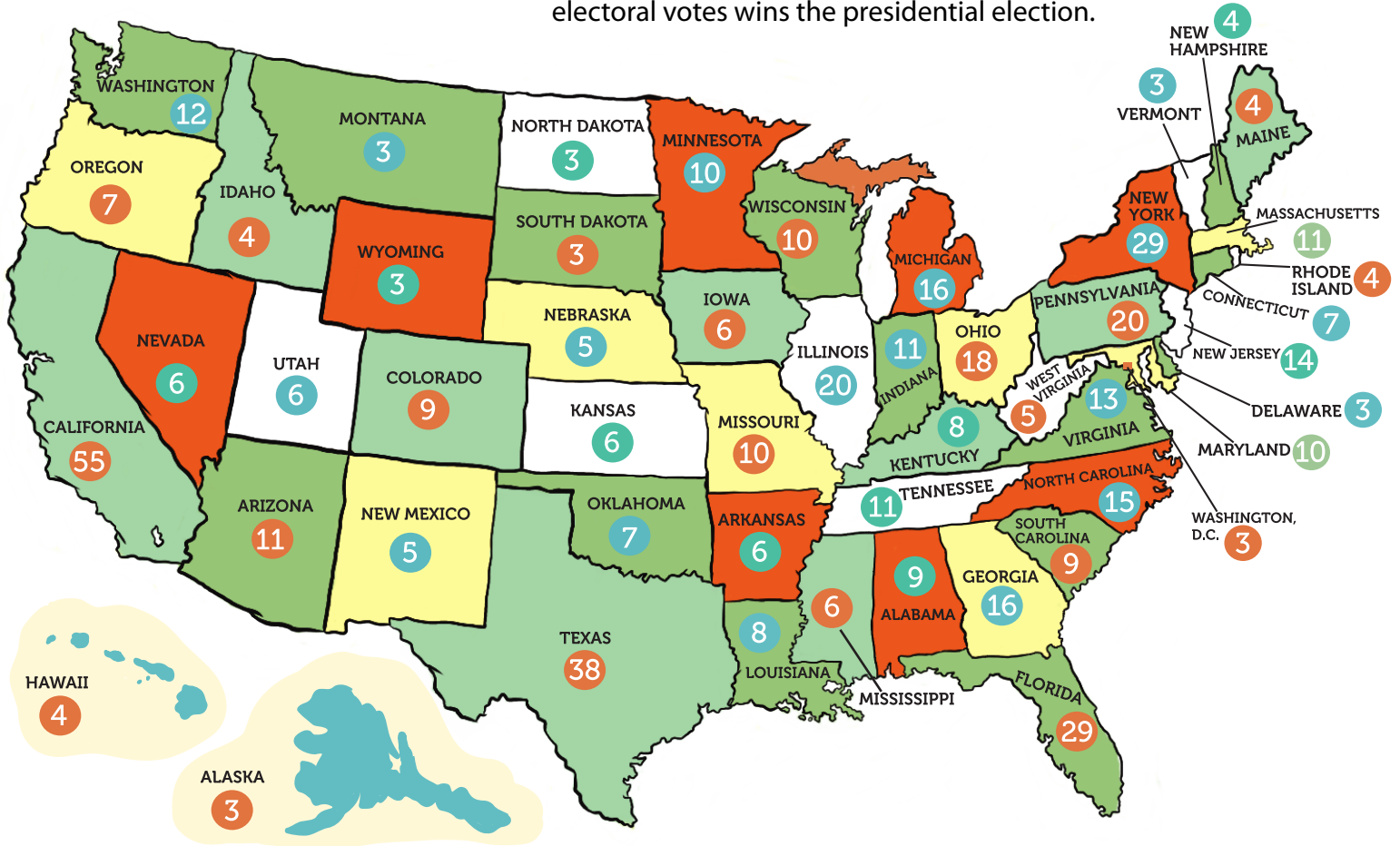


ELECTORAL VOTE

The president and vice president are elected in a presidential election. The winner of a presidential election is determined by electoral votes. Each state's population determines its number of electoral votes. When a candidate wins the vote in a state, they win all the electoral votes for that state. In every state except Maine and Nebraska, if a candidate wins the vote, they win all the electoral votes for that state. The candidate with more than half the total electoral votes wins the presidential election.



Using the map, solve the equations:

Example: North Carolina + Missouri: $15 + 10 = 25$

Virginia + Ohio

Minnesota + Utah

Florida + Georgia + Alabama

Maine + Hawaii + New Mexico

Washington + Michigan + Maryland

Pennsylvania + New Hampshire + Iowa
