The president and vice president are elected in a presidential
 election. The winner of a presidential election is determined by electoral votes. Each state's population determines its number of electoral votes. When a candidate wins the vote in a state, they win all the electoral votes for that state. In every state except Maine and Nebraska, if a candidate wins the vote, they win all the electoral votes for that state. The candidate with more than half the total
