Endings with **-er** and **-est**



For most adjectives that require an -er or -est, you can simply add one of the endings. If the word already ends in e, drop the e, then add either **-er** or **-est**.

Words with -er are used to **compare** or show that something is **more** than something else. Words that end in -est show that something is the **most**.

Special Spelling Patterns for -er and -est Words

If the word ends in y change the y to an i before you add -er or -est.
If the word has a CVC pattern double the consonant before you add -er or -est.
